Knowing people who are sleeping on the streets, in parks, tents, cars or temporary accommodation by name, helps us to make visible those who are often unseen.

Brisbane By-Name List is a list of people experiencing homelessness in our community which can be updated in real time. Using information collected by the Brisbane Zero Collective and shared with their consent, we can understand their homeless history, housing, health, and support needs.

This enables us to better match housing solutions and identify relevant supports, particularly for the most vulnerable.

This data is updated monthly, at minimum.










